
Rt. Rev. Eugene Hayes, O.S.B., is the Abbot of St. Michael's Abbey in Silverado, California. He entered the Norbertines in 1973 and was ordained in 1977. After ordination he earned a J.C.D. in Canon Law and served as the procurator general for the worldwide Norbertine Order in Rome. Abbot Eugene was elected Abbot for St. Michael's Abbey in 1995.

Rev. Brian Mullady, O.P., taught moral theology at the *Angelicum* in Rome and at the University of St. Thomas in Houston, Texas. Currently he teaches theology at Holy Apostles College and Seminary in Cromwell, Connecticut, and as adjunct professor at the Graduate School of Christendom College as part of the *Vita Consecrata* Institute. In addition to conducting retreats and missions around the country, Father also serves as theological consultant for the IRL.

Rev. Thomas Nelson, O.PRAEM., is a priest of St. Michael's Abbey in Silverado, California, a community of Norbertine Canons. He has a Licentiate in Sacred Theology from the Pontifical University of St. Thomas Aquinas in Rome. He is the National Director of the INSTITUTE ON RELIGIOUS LIFE, and the Director of the IRL's *Vita Consecrata* Institute, as well as a sought-after lecturer in philosophy, spirituality and on the consecrated life.

Ms. Sequoia Sierra is a member of the Lay Norbertine Order under St. Michael's Abbey in Silverado, California. She owns and operates *The Liturgical Co.*, focusing on vestments, habits, and restoration work and *Sophisticates Media*, that focuses on social media and Google ads for small businesses, non-profits and religious orders. She is currently working on a new show hosted by the Diocese of Orange called "A Culture of Beauty," and she teaches etiquette courses for children and religious.
